1-30-03 *Notifying Parents About Alcohol-Related Offenses* (Noting that FERPA may allow schools to notify parents of underage students about alcohol-related offenses, but that act may still involve common law tort of invasion of privacy).

1-30-03 *Sex Offenders on Campus? Duty to Notify...* (Deals with registries and new law requiring sex offenders to register with campus police - and this column deals with whether the campus has a duty to notify residents in a hall that a new resident is a registered sex offender.)

2-7-03 *May Campus Clubs Discriminate?* (This column explores the notion that, perhaps, public colleges can no longer require clubs to be bias free. Column discusses Dale v. Boy Scouts and then also deals with a case from the 60s dealing with a white fraternity's suit against Colorado Regents, claiming the fraternity had a right to engage in racial bias.

2-14-03 *Free Speech Zones Curtail Free Speech* (This column explores the use of free speech zones on campuses, where only a few areas may be used for free speech activities. This column noted that the zones may not be reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions.)

1-20-03 *Students Target of Copyright Suits* (This column explains to readers how copyright litigation would soon reach students. The column talked about the Verizon litigation, where music producers got access to names of users from ISPs.)

2-28-03 *Is This Any Way to Select Lawyers* (This piece focused on affirmative action issues relating to the low numbers of minority law students and addressed how the LSAT may be a key factor.)

2-06-03 *Legality of Legacies* (This piece focused on the use development and legacy admissions and how the practice could be a breach of contract, if nothing else.)

2-19-03 *Rights of Students During Draft* (This piece dealt with the commotion caused by the invasion of Iraq and the concerns of students regarding a draft. This piece talked about how registration and draft laws would apply, if the President requested Congress to begin induction.)

2-26-03 *Rights of Protesters* (This piece discussed the rights of students who staged protests on campus, often violating school rules relating to speech and assembly.)

3-13-03 *Zoning Laws that Discriminate Against Students* (This article was directed at situations in Iowa and Alabama, where student tenants were forced out of homes in single family zones)

3-14-03 *Homophobia at Iowa State* (This commentary focused on efforts by Iowa State faculty and students to prevent university support for the Boy Scouts. This article discussed the legality of denying the BSA benefits.)

3-15-03 *9th Circuit Limits Student Academic Freedom* (This piece focused on the 9th Circuit ruling in *Brown v. Li*, a case holding that UC officials could revoke a student's thesis because his thesis's dedication was disrespectful. I pointed out how this case could be very harmful, largely because the 9th Cir found that a case that had applied only to elementary school students, *Hazelwood Sch. Dist., v. Kuhlmeier.*)

3-27-03 *War Protester Leaves BYU Over Honor Code* (This article talked about the case of a student protester who was arrested for protesting the Iraqi war. Because of the arrest, he noted that he violated the BYU Honor Code, which prohibits violation of any law. So he left school. This commentary pointed

out how students who violated Jim Crow laws also faced expulsion for doing so, but that federal courts found those laws to be violative of due process.)

4-4-03 Hazing or Sexual Assault (This article dealt with an unusual case of sexual assault at the Uni of Kentucky)

4-12-03 Copyright & File Sharing Liability (This article explained to college students why copyright litigation is lucrative for the recording companies and their attorneys.)

5-19-03 Recognizing Hate Crimes on Campus (This article focused on hate crimes at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo (eggs thrown at GLBT booth) and a hate crime at the Univ of Oregon (lesbian candidate for office had apartment ransacked). This article pointed out that a hate crime can be committed when the violence is directed at the victim's personal property.

5-26-03 Tenure Disputes and Race This article discussed cases where profs have charged schools with racial bias in the tenure and promotion process. The article was particularly directed at disputes at Cal State Fullerton and SDSU.

5-1-03 GLBT Students on Campus. This article focused on the NGLTF Study noting the harm glbt students face on campus.

6-4-04 Students and Faculty Romantic/Sexual Relationships. This article explained the rationale why schools needed to take measures to restrict sexual relations between students and faculty.

1-2-03 HIV & ADA: HIV Positive Man Fired (discussing recent cases finding that HIV positive persons can be barred from working in dental surgery).

2-12-03 Super Gay & Lesbian Lawyers (profiling the major accomplishments of local gay and lesbian lawyers, including Profs. Marilyn Ireland, Scott Ehrlich and Barbara Cox).

2-26-03 *Do Teachers Teach at the Mercy of Students?* (commenting on a California appellate case denying a teacher any recovery against a five-year-old child who falsely accused him of sexual abuse).

4-21-03 *Amber Alert Hidden Laws* (revealing aspects of new federal law making it easy for federal officials to confiscate real property - and to prosecute persons for misleading use of Internet domain names).

4-29-03 *Are GLBT Students Safe on Campus* (reviewing National Gay & Lesbian Task Force Report on the safety issues affecting glbt students on college campuses).

5-5-03.1.1.1 *Lesbians Denied Family Benefits at Country Club* (discussing a San Diego case, where a lesbian couple had sued for marital status bias when club refused to extend them same rights afforded married couples at club).

5-11-03 *Reparations for GLBT Victims of Bias* (noting the trend towards compensating victims of discrimination and asking why GLBT persons should be treated differently).

5-18-03 *Adultery in Domestic Partnerships* (comparing laws restricting married couples versus unmarried couples).

5-25-03 *Outing Based Upon Court Records* (presenting an Idaho case, where a 76-year-old man was reported to be gay based upon a court document from the 50s).

6-2-03 *Gay Immigrant May Get Citizenship* (focusing on issues relating to political asylum and how gay and transgendered persons have obtained citizenship through the asylum process).

7-17-03 #812, at 38 "Library Filters, AIDS and Gay Studies" (Discussion of Supreme Court upholding the Children's Internet Protection Act and the decision's impact on other forms of Congressional censorship through Congressional spending limitations.)

7-24-03 #813, at 63, 68 "Taking Pride and Giving Thanks" (Discussion of landmark cases decided by Supreme Court involving glbt rights: Bowers, Romer, Lawrence, Dale, Southworth. Also noted is the affect of Justice Anthony M. Kennedy.

6-30-03 #814, at 38, 39 "Supreme Court Wrap-Up for 2003" (Discussion of major Supreme Court cases from 2002-2003 term and impact on glbt rights: focus on affirmative action cases, sodomy, and library filtering cases; also focus on cases denied cert. and what impact they have (focus on cases here on transgendered rights).

8-07-03 #815, at 34 "Who's Hot? Who's Not? Should it Matter on the Job?" (Discussion explores suit filed by employees of youth-oriented Abercrombie & Fitch over the clothing chain's hiring practices (e.g., young white teens) – and the article discusses employment cases dealing with bias based upon one's attractiveness.)

8-14-03 #816, at 35, 37 "Killer Set Free by Cal. Supreme Court" (Article deals with recent Cal. Sup. Ct. case, *People v. Neal*, wherein the court found that killer of an elderly gay man should not have had his confession admitted. Article focuses on claims by young killers that the older gay man made a sexual advance and that justified using deadly force in response.)

8-21-03 #817, at 35 "State Laws Require Schools to Ignore GLBTs" (This article notes how the Lawrence case (striking down same-sex sodomy laws) should apply to state laws requiring schools to teach that gay relations are illegal).

8-28-03 #818, at 34 "Adoption Agency Engaged in Bias" (Discussion of case filed by lesbian couple against private adoption agency that refused to complete their application for foster parenting and adoption once it knew they were lesbians.)

9-4-03 #819, at 34 "Converting Straight Kids to Gay Not Working" (Presented litigation involving a group of parents against a California school, which was presenting a diversity play to students. Parents contended that it violated their "parenting rights." Article here noted recent federal appellate court case dismissing a similar suit.)

9-11-03 #820, at 34, 36 "Gay Stereotypes on TV" (Commentary discusses negative stereotypes of minorities and how legal avenues were pursued to get more positive images).

9-18-03 #821, at 37 "New SD Police Chief Should End Double Standard" (Commentary discussing *Aluyut v. Superior Court* and Penal Code sections 647(a) and 314 and how those latter code provisions have been unequally enforced against gay men and lesbians).

10-2-03 #823, at 37 "Gay Man Sued for not Telling Fiance He's Gay," discussing *Yang v. Lee*, a California Court of Appeal case discussing the rights of parties who share property prior to marriage and how California will not recognize failure to disclose one's sexual orientation as grounds for breach of promise to marry.

10-9-03 #824, at 34, 36, "Pastor's Plunge Lands Him in More Than Hot Water." (Discussion of invasion of privacy action against a t.v. station which had published photos from court file showing

pastor posing with topless women in hot tub. Despite the pastor's action to prevent continued publishing of photos, the court found the First Amendment prevailed over the privacy concerns.)

10-16-03 #825, at 33, "*Pat Robertson Jailed for Fornicating?*" (Commentary refers to Rev. Robertson's criticism of Supreme Court opinion in *Lawrence v. Texas* and note that Robertson himself admitted to committing a sexual crime called "fornication." Commentary discusses criminal statutes enacted by states to curtail premarital sexual relations.)

10-23-03 #826, at 33, 34, "*Outing as Invasion of Privacy.*" (Commentary discussing recent cases where litigants sued for invasion of privacy (public disclosure of private facts) when they were "outed" by employer(s) or public officials. Commentary examined the issue of whether "homosexuality" is still such a fact that would be "highly offensive" to the average person, thus worthy of damages for its intentional disclosure.)

10-30-03 #827, at 33 "*Catch the Real Criminals*" (presenting a discussion of *U.S. McCoy*, a federal appellate case holding that mother did not violate federal statute against federal possession of child pornography where she possessed one photo of her semi-nude young daughter).

11-06-03 #828, at 34 "*At the Mercy of ISP's (Internet Service Providers)*" (discussing recent federal and state cases holding that a federal statute ("Communications Decency Act of 1996) insulates ISPs from liability where users post defamatory or info that invades the privacy of others). Commentary argues that Congress needs to make ISPs accountable when they are informed that info they carry is harming someone.

11-13-03 #829, at 34 "*Legalize Lap Dancing*" (Discusses efforts by Los Angeles and San Diego to control adult entertainment in business that do not serve alcohol and discusses a California appellate ruling indicating that lap dancing is a protected art form that cannot necessarily be regulated in businesses that do not serve alcohol.)

11-20-03 #830, at 34-35 "*Congress to Study 'How to be Gay'*" (discussing efforts by Congress and state legislative bodies to control the curricular offerings at both public and private universities and how Congress may use federal spending strings to censor courses it doesn't agree with on political or social concerns).

11-27-03 #831, pg. 34, "*Should Teacher Lose License Over Prostitution?*" (focusing on the arrest of a male teacher for prostitution and the laws allowing states to revoke teacher licenses for immoral behavior).

12-04-03 #832, pg. 36, "*People vs. Michael Jackson,*" (highlighting a case where a man was convicted of sexually abusing boys by sucking their toes, and comparing this case to Michael Jackson's admission that he sleeps with young pre-teen boys).

12-11-03 #833, pg. 33, "*Are GLBT Professors Treated Differently,*" (reviewing the history of cases involving discrimination cases brought by GLBT professors and summarizing a recent study showing bias in student evaluations in reviewing GLBT faculty).

12-18-03 #834, pg. 34, "*Legal Inconsistencies in Adult-Minor Sex,*" (discussing a San Diego case where a teacher was convicted of a sex crime for having a consensual sexual relationship with a seventeen-year-old, and discussing legal issues relating to the age of consent for straight and gay sex).

12-25-03 #835, pg. 34, “*What Type of Homosexual Are You?*” (discussing textbooks in Sociology classes that classify homosexual behavior as deviant behavior and illegal – and pointing out the need for colleges to comply with new anti-discrimination laws affecting sexual orientation).

1-3-04 #836, pg. 33, “*Gay Sex Addict Can’t Sell Real Estate*”) (commenting on an appellate court case upholding the ruling from the Department of Real Estate that a gay man, twice convicted of lewd conduct, cannot be a real estate agent).

1-8-04 #837, pg. 34, “*Sex Toys Outlawed*” (focusing on Texas statute prohibiting the sale of “obscene devices” and prosecution of woman for selling “sex toys” in Texas; also focus on *Williams v. Pryor*, federal court case striking down Alabama statute prohibiting sale of sexual devices in Alabama).

1-15-04 #838 pg. 34, “*GSA Must Allow Homophobes at its Forum*,” (criticizing *Hansen v. Ann Arbor Public Schools* for requiring gay-straight student group to permit anti-gay speaker to participate in forum on gays and religion).

1-22-04 #839, pg. 34, “*Sex Researcher or Gay Sex Predator*,” (detailing sexual harassment suit filed by male students against Indiana State University, alleging sexual abuse by professor under the guise of sexual research).

1-29-04 #840, pg. 33, “*Farewell to Porn*,” (discussing new efforts by Department of Justice to bring obscenity charges for non-child pornography claims in the absence of over a decade such prosecutions; discusses the Miller test for obscenity and the differing results likely to occur in different locales).

2-5-04 #841, pg. 33, “*Sex with the Dead*,” (studying the novel issues involving sex crimes with corpses and those believed to be not dead; highlighting *People v. Thompson* (rapist not charged with rape because victim was dead) and other cases involving necrophilia).

10-19.06 #982, "Attorney general election critical to GLBT civil rights," (introducing A.G. candidates and how the A.G.'s office influence glbt cases).

10-26.06 #983, "House of Blues sees red, 'Reader' publisher needs to see door," (profiling incident where entertainment venue featured a performer whose music included anti-gay lyrics, and noting how "hostile environment" law can apply to patrons).

11-02.06 #984, "Bush, Justice Dept. must indict Foley and others," (discussing how federal law requires reporting of child abuse even committed by members of Congress).

11-09.06 #985, "Jury slaps Starbucks with \$250,000 verdict," (noting recent trial court case involving same-sex sexual harassment).

11-16.06 #986, "Democratic Congress should push laws a majority of Americans support," (highlighting federal legislation protecting glbts that polling shows broad support for, e.g., hate crimes, job and housing discrimination).

11-23.06 #987, "Jerry Brown should enforce GLBT civil rights," (commenting on election results and how new state attorney general could aid in the enforcement of civil rights laws).

11-30.06 #988, "The gay agenda for 2007-09 legislative session," (focusing on bills legislators should consider introducing and passing in new leg session).

12-07.06 #989, "Status of the American male not very good," (commenting on the health and social problems plaguing men, particularly focusing on the incarceration rate of men of color, and calling for creation of state commission on "status of men.")

12-14.06 #990, "Double standards and public sex," (commenting on police sting operation in Malibu, where police arrested same-sex, but not opposite sex, couples engaged in sex).

12-21.06 #991, "House foxes guard the chicken hawk," (criticizing Congressional inaction on finding members of Congress in leadership posts guilty of violating federal law mandating reporting for child abuse).

12-28.06 #992, "Filner to play 007 in '07," (praising work of local Congress member for tackling issues of concern to glbt community, particularly with regard to glbt veterans).

01-04.07 #993, "Will same-sex marriage be legal before year's end?" (predicting reasons why the California Supreme Court might hold that both federal and state constitutions prohibit discrimination by federal and state in marriage rights).

01-11.07 #994, "High school wrestler charged as rapist," (profiling an Idaho case where a high school student charged as rapist when he used a wrestling move with opponents).

01-18.07 #995, "City has millions for private lawyers, nothing for police," (commenting on excessive legal fees incurred by local city council, and proposing that when local officials need "independent" counsel, they should be limited to public defender rates).

01-25.07 #996, *"The Duke players and the Chargers' Steve Foley,"* (discussing the role of race in two crimes receiving national attention, and noting that college players, who hosted strippers and direct racially derogatory names at them while they groped them, could have been charged under California law with hate crimes).

02-01.07 #997, *"Gay's Anatomy: gay TV characters now commonplace,"* (profiling the glbt characters on t.v. and how stereotyping of gays even on gay-friendly shows, continues to perpetuate anti-gay bias).

02-08.07 #998, *"Gays with guns in Hillcrest,"* (examining recent upswing in crime and noting the laws dealing with carrying concealed weapons for protection).

02-15.07 #999, *"Dealing diligently with dangerous people in Hillcrest,"* (noting that various laws against "stalking" and "nuisance" should be employed against persons engaging in violent criminal conduct).

02-22.07 #1000, *"Gay teachers, their Web sites and double standards,"* (profiling disciplinary review of local gay teacher's MySpace profile and whether provocative content on site should be basis for disciplinary action or considered private matter).

03-01.07 #1001, *"Rev. Haggard and the 'New Church of the Penis',"* (profiling case of outed minister and discussing recent cases suggesting religious sexual practices could be subject to legal protection).

03-08.07 #1002, *"Hillary and Barack act just like the white dudes on same-sex marriage,"* (criticizing presidential candidates for failing to apply same standards involving race cases to glbt issues).

03-15.07 #1003, *"Public officials should resign,"* (analyzing recent California case (*People v. Chacon*), where court held public officials cannot rely on legal advice from city attorneys they control, especially in matters where conflict of interest advice sought).

03-22.07 #1004, *"Federal court grants same-sex couples a 'burden' of marriage,"* (analyzing recent federal bankruptcy case holding that domestic partners in California must be treated as a "married couple" and not as two individuals when filing for homestead exemptions).

03-29.07 #1005, *"Handicapping local races for expected GLBT candidates,"* (discussing the effect local government officials have on local ordinances and profiling local candidates).

04-05.07 #1006, *"Assemblymember Portantino to champion higher education,"* (profiling new chair of Assembly Higher Education Committee and role he can play with regard to glbt programs and anti-gay bias in higher education in California).

04-12.07 #1007, *"Bad boys behind bars,"* (profiling Texas case where guards sexually abused male juvenile inmates and added time to sentences for those who refused).

04-19.07 #1008, *"Same-sex marriage and the city of San Diego,"* (discussing briefs filed by city of San Francisco in marriage cases and calling upon city of San Diego to join with San Francisco).

04-26.07 #1009, "Anti-gay bias on Internet, in high schools," (discussing recent appellate court ruling holding adoption agency liable for anti-gay bias on its website, even though adoption agency is in Arizona).

05-03.07 #1010, "The truth behind Carol Lam and her campaign against public corruption," (profiling the tenure of local united states attorney and reviewing public corruption cases involving Duke Cunningham and local councilmembers).

05-10.07 #1011, "Brideless weddings and girly men: a collection of shorts," (discussing, among other topics, legal issues that arise with hotels refusing to allow "same sex" marriages).

05-17.07 #1012, "Free Paris! Watch Perez pay! (And other celebrity lawbreakers)," (profiling celebrity newsmakers, with a focus on Hollywood gossip blogger (Perez Hilton) and copyright claims against him by photographers, claiming copyright infringement against his "fair use/parody" defense).

05-24.07 #1013, "Discriminatory classified advertising on Internet," (focusing on recent 9th Circuit ruling (*Fair Housing Council v. Craigslist*), holding federal law immunizing websites does not protect site from fair housing claims where site requests users to indicate preferences based upon race and/or sexual orientation).

05-31.07 #1014, "The drag queen and the death penalty," (profiling murder case where death row inmate claims denial of due process because a member of the jury (a drag queen), knew the victim and the defendant's lover, but didn't disclose it during voir dire or during trial).

06-07.07 #1015, "Blood and dating discrimination," (discussing Bush Administration and FDA refusal to allow Red Cross to collect blood from gay men; also discussion of whether E-Harmony (an Internet matching service) can refuse (under Calif. law) to discriminate on basis of sexual orientation).

06-14.07 #1016, "Bush administration wages final assault in war on porn," (discussing recent efforts by Department of Justice to pursue obscenity cases not involving child pornography, and discussing whether *Lawrence v. Texas* sets the stage for Supreme Court allowing pornography featuring consenting adults).

San Diego men captured naked on hidden cam," (profiling the existence of website (run by San Diego company) featuring video images of naked men who don't know they are being filmed, and raising legal issues concerning federal laws prohibiting featuring nudity without complying with federal verification laws).

06-28.07 #1018, "Some San Diego men don't know they're gay porn stars," (discussing existence of x-rated YouTube sites featuring amateur porn, and column raises issues relating to "consent" and verification laws and cases).

07-05.07 #1019, "Padres should set free the Set Free Ministries," (commenting on religious group's refusal to work at ballgame during a promotional night featuring a gay men's chorus, and whether such refusal to work violates local and state anti-bias laws).

07-12.07 #1020, "Bill Gates becomes GLBT media leader," (profiling the purchase of gay media giant PlanetOut by Microsoft founder Bill Gates, and explaining how businesses counteract anti-gay bias by advertising in gay media).

07-19-07 #1021, "San Diego Pride and Prejudice," (discussing appearance by Democratic candidates for President at NAACP convention and contrasting that appearance with upcoming debate on gay issues asking how candidates distinguish *Loving v. Virginia* from cases involving same sex marriage).

Morse* (holding First Amendment does not protect student speech advocating illegal drug use) and pointing out how the opinions by at least six justices suggesting that First Amendment protects glbt student groups).
