His teaching experience at Case and Columbia includes Criminal Justice Clinic, International Human Rights, advanced negotiation, and Legal Research and Writing. His prior practice experience includes extensive work with the criminal division of the Legal Aid Society of New York, where he not only handled trials and appeals, but directed the training of new lawyers in trial practice.
