

Cal Western's Kim named to distinguished professorship

California Western School of Law Professor Nancy S. Kim has been named as the ProFlowers Distinguished Professor of Internet Studies for her work highlighting the risks of online contracts. She has become a nationally recognized scholar in the legal dialogue over "wrap" contracts -- contracts created when an internet user clicks on "agree," "accept terms," or a similar link -- often not knowing they have entered into a legally binding contract. She is the author of the recently published book "Wrap Contracts: Foundations and Ramifications," which has garnered critical praise.

Kim's efforts epitomize California Western's commitment to research in emerging areas of the law, and along with the school's New Media Rights Clinic, ensure that federal rules and laws protect the rights of content creators and owners.

She joined the California Western faculty in the fall of 2004. She has taught as a visiting faculty member at Ohio State University, Moritz College of Law, Rady School of Management at UC San Diego, and Victoria University in Wellington, New Zealand.

Kim currently serves as Chair of the Section on Contracts and as a member of the executive committee of the section on Commercial and Related Consumer Law of the Association of American Law Schools (AALS).
