



Cal Western's Community Law Project receives \$21,500 grant

The Price Philanthropies Foundation has awarded California Western School of Law's Community Law project a \$21,500 grant for its legal clinic in City Heights. The Community Law Project provides free legal information in a variety of areas to low-income residents.

In City Heights, the project offers free weekly clinics at Hoover High School and Rosa Parks Elementary.
