

SCHOLARLY WRITING & PRACTICUM REQUIREMENTS
AND COURSE DESIGNATIONS

Students are required to submit work satisfying the Scholarly Writing Requirement and successfully complete 15 units of Experiential (EXP) coursework as outlined in Academic Policy 2.01(B). Students matriculating after August 1, 2016 are subject to the 15 unit EXP requirement. Students matriculating before August 1, 2016 are subject to the prior Practicum graduation requirement.

Each course listed in the class schedules has one of the following designations listed between the course number and name of the course on the "course list by requirement" page. The following is a description of the course designations to assist you.

- EXP The course satisfied the definition of experiential in our policies. See Academic Policy §2.01(B).
- LAW A course that requires a written final examination, and doesn't carry one of the following designations:
- PRAC The course satisfies the definition of practicum in our policies. See Academic Policy §2.01(B).
- SWR The course requires all students to write SW (scholarly writing) papers. **PLEASE BE AWARE THAT ALL STUDENTS ENROLLED IN AN SWR COURSE WILL BE REQUIRED TO WRITE AN SW PAPER EVEN IF THEY ALREADY SATISFIED THE SW REQUIREMENT.** See Academic Policy §2.01(B).
- PR\SW The course satisfies the definition of PRAC (practicum) and you have the option of writing an SW paper.
- SW\OP The course permits you to write an SW paper or non-SW paper.
- SW\EO The course permits you to write an SW paper or take a final exam.
- EX\SW The course requires an exam but also permits you to satisfy the SW requirement if you wish.
- SEM A seminar course. The course has limited enrollment. All students are required to write papers, but no SW credit is given.
- NOTE:** **Legal Scholarship Training Seminar must be taken during the trimester in which the student is fulfilling their SW requirement. This course need not be repeated if the student takes a subsequent SWR course.**

PREREQUISITES & COREQUISITES

A prerequisite course must be taken and passed prior to registering for the named course. A corequisite course must be taken at the same time as the named course.

You must satisfy these requirements or you can be dropped from the course at any time during the trimester.

Always remember to carefully read the footnotes in the trimester class schedules for updated information on prerequisites and corequisites. This is especially true for new courses or courses with prerequisites that may vary by instructor.

The only way you can register for a course without satisfying the prerequisites or corequisites is by obtaining the professor's permission to waive the prerequisite or take the course concurrently.
